- > Awards (like beltloops) and rank badges are paid for by the Pack.

- > We give a max of 2 beltloops per month and they are earned from activities that have been accomplished this school year. If a scout earns swimming this year and again next year, he'll get the metal beltloop awarded the first year and a mini certificate the next year. Some of Webelos IIs have earned soccer or baseball all 5 years they've been in Cub Scouts.

- > The beltloop is easily completed with 3-4 basic requirements. The pin takes more effort/time to earn.

- > Parents determine when a scout has met the requirements.

- > When your son completes a beltloop or pin, just drop me an email or let Virginia know and she'll

pass it along to me. I usually order awards 1-2 weeks before each Pack meeting. If we miss it this month, we'll have it ready for next month's meeting.
